



#### **Leading Lives Together**

At our Annual Meeting each May, we come together to vote in a new board of trustees and a new nominating committee. This year, we'll hold these votes on Sunday, May 20<sup>th</sup> @ 12:30-ish after we all enjoy food and fellowship at a good old-fashioned potluck.

It's easy to take this leadership transition for granted if you're not directly involved in the nominating process or the board itself. But all Peoples people should use this annual ritual to reflect on the nature of leadership in our faith community.

Why? Because we rely on our leaders to help make our church happen. If we're to build the vibrant, welcoming, and supportive faith community we seek, we must all actively participate in and support that leadership.

Leadership at Peoples Church is vested formally in the board of trustees, our staff, and the team (committee) leaders (chairs). But leadership is also vested informally in everyone who helps to shape our faith community through presence, participation, and pledging.

#### So, consider:

- What does it mean to entrust our organization's leadership to fellow members?
- What responsibility do we each have to participate in leadership?
- Who do you know and trust to be a potential leader?
- What should we as a community expect of our leaders?
- How can we help our leaders meet our expectations?

Reflecting individually on these leadership questions is only the first step. We should also talk about them with other Peoples people. Talk about them with current leaders and past leaders and potential future leaders.

Talk about what it means to both participate in leadership, and to help each other grow into leaders within our faith community. Together.

#### FINANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

Finance Committee met on 4/19/18 to review financial reports, discuss reserve recommendations, and continued to refine narrative budget plan.

Peoples Church cash flow was positive for the first quarter (Jan-Feb-Mar):

- First Quarter Income \$54,988 (including endowment disbursement and fundraising activities)
- First Quarter Expenses \$46,759



#### **Board of Trustee Meeting Summary**

#### **April 25, 2018**

- Treasurer Gary McGraw reported by email that our first quarter ended with a net positive income.
- We discussed Chapter 7 of our common read Leading Change in the Congregation. We read our board covenant together and discussed ways to periodically evaluate how well we're living up to it. We also talked about healthy communication, especially in situations of disagreement. We committed to expressing questions or concerns directly to the people involved rather than through 3rd parties. Our job as leaders is to model this kind of direct communication.
- Judy Price and Marcy Mattison presented current progress on the stained glass windows project and answered questions. We will take up their revised project proposal and construction budget at the May board meeting. The Windows & Aesthetics

- Teams will present an update at the May 20 Congregational Meeting as well.
- We reviewed a new policy for Our Whole Lives facilitators created by David Wise and Rev.
  Rebecca. We also discussed the board's role and how this review process fits within a policy governance framework.
- We continued our work on the Developmental Ministry governance goal by reviewing the Nested Bowls of Values, Mission, and Ends. We will begin explaining ends statements to the congregation at our June 9 Mission in Action Retreat.

# SANCTUARY DESIGN PROJECT PROGRESS









Judy Price and Charlie Cizio visited Robert Fassler, owner of Artistic Glass in Fairfax, on April 13 to see the progress in restoring the ROSE window. As reported previously, the wood structure of the stained glass was in much worse condition than expected. Not only had the wood joints deteriorated over the eighty-six (86) years the windows were at the 600 Third Avenue SE building, but when it was removed, it was crudely cut out of its frame. The pictures show the work in progress. However, Robert hopes to have the window restored and back to us in early June.

The good news is that Robert would be willing to provide consultation and supervision to install our stained glass in the sanctuary.


