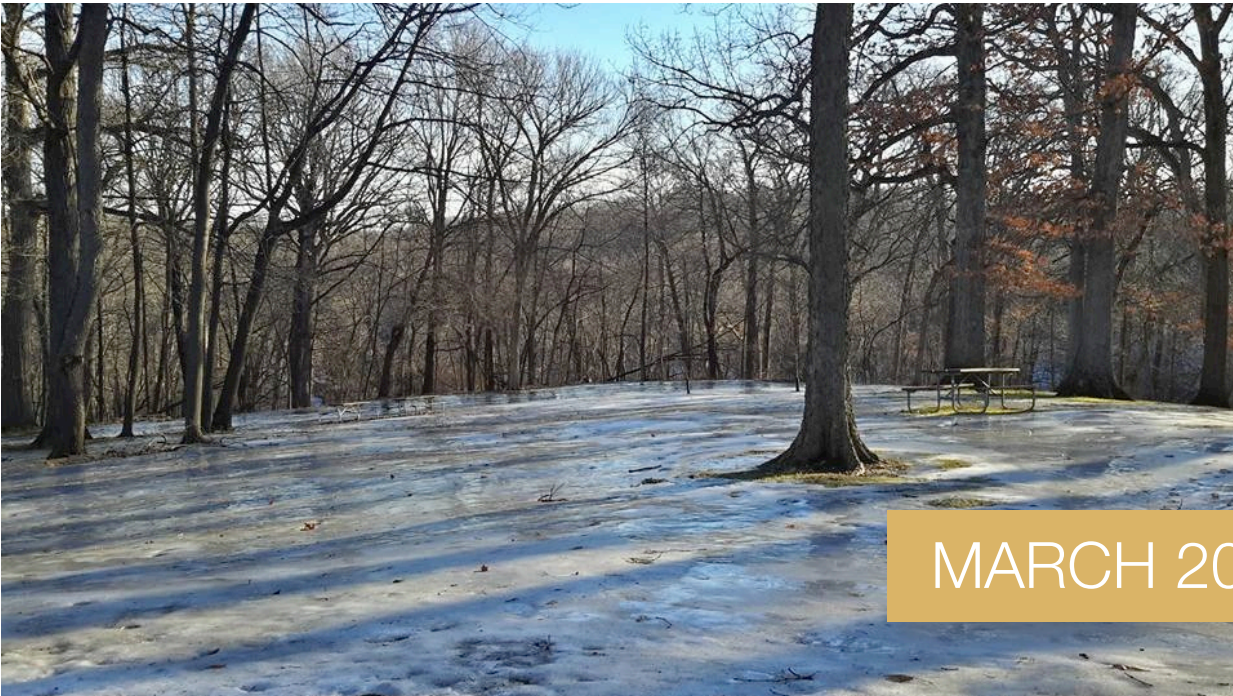

Minister's *Moment*

The Still, Small Voice Within

Have you ever felt apprehensive because you were the recipient of too much good luck? Ever had the feeling that it's too much, too fast, that you don't deserve your good fortune? I remember a scene in *Funny Girl*, starring Barbra Streisand as Fanny Brice. She has difficulty accepting her initial success. "No, it can't be," she wails. "I should have suffered more."

I remembered that scene because a newlywed friend was thinking about buying a house. So she went window shopping, never expecting to find the perfect house in the first hour of her search. The house was the right size, the right price, in the right place and even the right color. Yet she hesitated. And she questioned the wisdom of buying it.

Another friend once had three jobs come to him. He was looking for work, but hadn't started in earnest, and three jobs fell right into his lap. For two of them, he was hired over the telephone. He was the right person for the jobs at the right time. Naturally, he questioned the wisdom of accepting something that was given to him.

I told my newlywed friend to put up some earnest money right away and make the house a home of love. I told my other friend to accept the offers and do a good job and be proud of his work.

We only have a few chances to listen to that "still, small voice within," the voice that tells us what to do. The voice doesn't holler, but it's clear enough if you listen. It doesn't really speak, either. But it communicates all the same. It takes a little practice to learn to hear the voice. On the other hand, I suppose if you work at it, you can learn to ignore it.

I suggest you listen.

Take advantage of your good fortune. Not with pride, but with humility. Things are presented to you because you can do something with them; opportunities come your way because you are the right person at the right time in the right place.

Take pride in what you can accomplish with your skills and your good fortune. Consider your opportunities as a chance to make the world a better place.

Board of Trustees News

Board Meeting Summary

- We will begin investigating options for the ash tree on our property: whether to attempt to prevent ash borer infestation, or to remove the tree.
- Treasurer Gary McGraw reported January's month-end balance was negative, in part due to the annual insurance payment processed during that month.
- Board President Bryan Davis reported on plans to restructure the stewardship campaign to extend over a longer time period. The goals are:
 1. To give congregation members more time to discuss and decide on their pledges,
 2. To begin/end the campaign earlier in the year. Ending the campaign earlier will allow the finance committee and board more time to create the budget for congregational approval at the December meeting.
- We discussed revisions to the draft membership and disruptive person policies. We approved the draft membership policy, and will review additional revisions to the disruptive person policy at the March meeting. Both policies will be presented to the congregation for approval in May.
- Board member Geoff Johnson will move forward with the Hy-Vee coupon book fundraiser again this year.

The Peoples Finance Committee met February 18 to review the 2016 pledge campaign results and financial reports. The finance committee approved plans for a modified campaign for 2017 in coordination with the Board and Canvass staff.

Peoples Church cash flow for January was negative:

Money we took in January:	\$12,100
Amount spent in January:	\$15,229

The Nominating Committee is recruiting members for the Board of Trustees to begin terms in May.

CLOSER TO HOME, consider [Camp Unistar](#), on Cass Lake near Bemidji, Minnesota. The camp's waterfront offers a wide range of activities. The island's forest trails attract hikers. Sunrises and sunsets encourage meditation. Each year UniStar campers return for the serenity and community, with no roads or commercial enterprise, and enjoy a week filled with thought-provoking programs, wonderful meals, and memorable experiences. During the season, camp offers 12 weeks with various programs – some for youth only, some for adults only, most for a combination of individuals to family groups. The five cabins and the upper floor of the Lodge each have three to four simple bedrooms, a bathroom with a tub, and a basic kitchen with sink, refrigerator, and microwave.

The season opens with a work week fixing up the camp, and two youth weeks for people entering 7th through 12th grades. In addition to staff, camp capacity each week is up to 70 campers, who are housed in sleeping rooms in the cabins and the upstairs of the main lodge, or in a tenting area beside the lake.

The camp is owned by the Camp UniStar Foundation, affiliated with the MidAmerica Region of the Unitarian Universalist Association. The camp is a member of CU2C2, the Council of Unitarian Universalist Camps and Conferences. This uniquely Minnesotan, uniquely Unitarian Universalist camp is a place that is special to so many hearts.
