Letter from the Board President Name Our Most Precious Values in 3...2...1...Go!

As Unitarian Universalists, we affirm seven Principles. Can you name them all without looking? (I needed to look.) We hold these Principles up as our ideals, as guides to envision the kinds of communities we strive to build in our churches and the wider world.

But are these Principles enough? Do they express all the values we need to build stronger communities? Values like generosity that leads us to understand rather than judge one another? Values like hospitality that leads us to make room for others in our lives and our spaces?

As we forge ahead in our Developmental Ministry, the Rev. Rebecca recommends we start with our values. Start by asking: What is most precious to us and how can we affirm and promote it in our church community?

Do all our values hold equal weight? If we chose the top three, which would make the cut? Would we choose personal commitment that leads us to actively participate in creating the communities we long for? What about the curiosity to ask questions, education for constant learning, hope, inspiration, joy, or creativity? How would these fit in?

We on the board invite everyone to begin thinking about our church's values. Think about what our church aspires to be, and how our personal values intersect with those aspirations.

And we encourage you to talk to Peoples people about it, ask others for their opinions and share your own ideas. Uncover your questions and insights and bring them to the Developmental Ministry Startup Event on November 18.

We'll start the evening at 6:00 PM with a potluck, and then get into the question and answer portion after we've all had a chance to eat.

Summary of the October 19 Board of Trustees Meeting

- Treasurer Gary McGraw reported that September finished well due to an influx of pledge payments. We still have a small year-to-date surplus as we head into the final quarter.
- Charles Cizio explained that one of the exterior panes of glass in the cross window
 was broken some time ago. He recently fixed the seal on the repair and noted some
 water damage to the inside of the wall. He solicited a bid to completely remove the
 cross window and re-side the exterior wall. The board will discuss next steps at our
 next meeting.
- We reviewed the 2017 budget first draft. While our pledged income for 2017 increased significantly over the current year's, we still anticipate drawing from our savings to make up a budget deficit.
- We discussed our Developmental Ministry goal of improving the church governance

Pledge Campaign Final Report

The 2017 Turning Point pledge campaign has officially ended, yielding these final results:

- We, as a congregation raised \$145,852 against our goal of \$165,000. This
 represents an increase of \$14,000 or 11% from last year's pledge campaign results.
- We had responses from nearly all 100 pledge units we originally contacted as part of the campaign.
- We received pledges from four people NEW to the church, some of whom expressed their desire to become members of Peoples.
- We have generally received positive comments about our efforts to keep the congregation well informed of progress as the campaign proceeded.

The campaign was completed by the middle of October, allowing budget development by Finance, and votes on the proposed budget by the Board and the congregation to proceed on schedule with full knowledge of what our funding will be for the year.

We did not meet the goal of 25% increase in pledge income, and must look at ways to make ends meet. We believe Peoples Church has approached The Turning Point and begun to "round the corner". We, as a congregation, achieved a substantial increase in pledges committed. But, beyond that, we sense a new level of optimism as we move toward 2017! With continued support from all of you, we believe we will be able to successfully chart our financial path through the next year.

The successes of the pledge campaign were due to the work of many. We could not have done this without you. Thanks to Rev. Rebecca; our administrator, Pam Edwards, the pledge stewards; those special individuals who gave wonderful testimonials, and all of you who have taken the time and energy to respond!

All Saints' Day is a time of solemn reflection and remembering. It reminds us that we are deeply connected with all those who have gone before us (i.e. the "communion of all saints," that "great cloud of witnesses"). It helps us remember that we are not alone. Join Rev. Rebecca and Marion Patterson at the 1080 Laughing Labyrinth as we gather together to honor our spiritual ancestors and reflect on Peoples Church past. We hope this moment of remembrance will offer healing and wholeness as Peoples Church moves together into a brighter future.

Dress for the weather. Options include walking the labyrinth or using a finger/lap labyrinth on the front porch. Warm beverages will be on hand.

Directions:

Our home is a white Cape Cod with dormers, a horseshoe drive and privet hedge out front. We are one mile east of First Ave. and one mile west of East Post Rd. SE. Mail box has our number 1080 on it. Pull in this side (west side of horseshoe drive). Pull around as far as you can and park driver tires on grass.

From First Avenue: turn at 29th St. Drive SE (John's Lock and Key and Walgreens). (This is the latest information. Remember construction constraints change!

Approach from Mt. Vernon Rd (or Cottage Grove Rd. SE) Go North on 34th St. SE, East on Cottage Grove Rd. about 1/3 mile just past the Orthodox Church to Indian Hill Rd. North to T. This is 30th St. Drive SE. West 2/10 mile past an old silver bus on north (R). Slow down.

Approach from East Post Road: Get to 30th St. Drive SE/Lakeside Drive (at a stop light). Drive west one mile past old silver bus on north (R). Slow down. Pull into our drive by the mail box on west part of the horseshoe drive.

Leaving: You can only turn to the east. So either go to Indian Hill Rd. south to Cottage Grove to 34th St. SE or First Ave. (depending on where you need to go); **OR** take 30th St. Drive SE east to East Post Rd. and whichever way you need to go.
