PEOPLES CHURCH TALKS ABOUT RACE AND CLASS MAY 6 AND 7: CLASS CONSCIOUSNESS WORKSHOP AND DISMANTLING WHITE-SUPREMACY TEACH-IN

There is an entangled relationship between race and class in our discourse. Some ask, which one is the real issue? But its not an either/or issue. Both matter. Peoples Church will explore these issues on May 6 and 7.

UUs have a long history of interest in social justice issues, especially those related to income inequality. But, what is our actual knowledge, awareness, and understanding of the institutional assumptions, laws, policies, and practices that tend to benefit white privileged people and exclude people of certain socio-economic statuses and especially people of color?

On May 6 we will explore how class differences are often invisible in our congregations, but yet they have an impact. Class awareness creates communities in

which people from all walks of life feel understood and valued.

Once equipped with this awareness, we can learn to be more effective in implementing social action strategies both internally and externally.

On May 7, Peoples will join over 500 other UU congregations to participate in a special service on dismantling racism and white supremacy. Black Lives of UU has asked all of us to look critically within our own faith communities at our hiring practices, power differentials, and cultural habits. We may understand how environmental and immigration injustice and voter suppression impacts people of color. The question is, what does this have to do with our congregation? On May 7 we will begin to address this question.

MAKE THEM HEAR YOU: SONGS OF PRIDE AND PROTEST

Join Peoples people for a mini-road trip and an evening of song and inspiration. We will be attending a concert by The Quire: Eastern Iowa's GLBT chorus entitled "Make Them Hear You: Songs of Pride and Protest." The date and time are Saturday, June 10 at 7:30 pm. The place is Zion Lutheran Church, 310 Johnson Street (corner of Johnson and Bloomington, near Mercy Hospital) in Iowa City. There is no admission charge; a freewill collection will be taken during the concert.

June is Pride Month, and this concert's theme reflects both pride in our accomplishments as a people, and encouragement for the struggle that continues. The group is a non-auditioned chorus open to all GLBTQ persons as well as allies who support the community. Several members of our congregation have sung with the Quire over the years, and two of us are current singers.

Meet at Peoples at 6:30 pm if you want to carpool/caravan to the event. A reception (with refreshments) will immediately follow the performance.

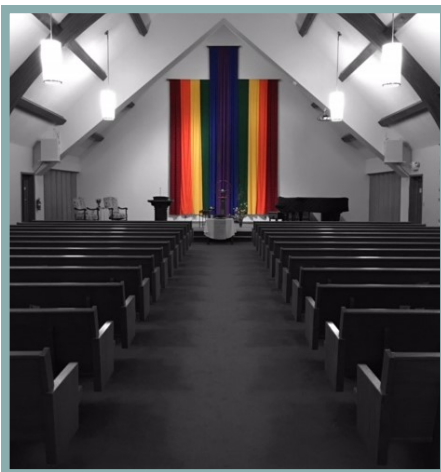
MAY 28TH

Earth-based Spirituality and Wicca 101 Classes

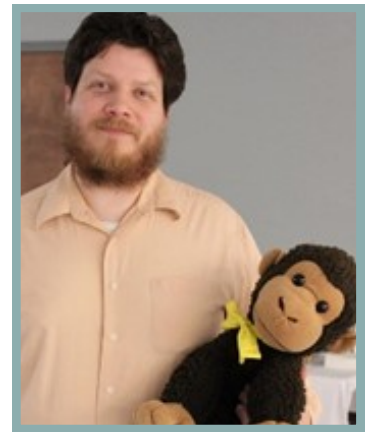
