Minister's Moment

What comes to mind when you think of leadership? Do you imagine someone busy defining projects, giving orders and telling others what to do? Do you picture someone involved in all aspects of a program or project, frantically working to keep all the parts running smoothly? If so, I suspect you are thinking more of a manager than a leader.

This is not surprising in the least. Management and leadership are often conflated, especially in smaller congregations like ours. When this happens leaders (lay leaders and ministers) often spend more of their time managing people and projects than actually leading the organization.

"But how can we get anything done if we don't have good management?" you ask. Good question! You can't. Every organization needs both good management and good leadership, but they are not the same thing. As Gil Rendle, an Alban Institute consultant and church leadership expert, says in "What Leadership Is... and Isn't," *management* is "something that makes the organization operate smoothly." Management tries to answer the question, "Are we doing things right?" By contrast, Rendle says, *leadership* asks the question, "Are we doing right things?"

In other words, management is focused on the details, reactive to what is happening in the present moment, and project oriented. Leadership is focused on the big picture, more proactive than reactive, and mission oriented. Managers make sure a project is completed and done well. Leaders

articulate the vision of the organization and inspire and empower others to work together towards that shared vision.

Luckily we have great leaders and managers at Peoples Church! And, like all volunteer organizations, we could always do better to further understand how to work together, how to develop clearer pathways to leadership positions, and how to sustain volunteer service of all kinds as a fulfilling, spiritual practice.

So, what would it look like to have more spiritually grounded, sustainable, healthy leadership and management at Peoples Church? What would it look like to have a governance model that was clear, easy to understand, and functioned to liberate people for action?

This month at Peoples Church we will explore these questions of leadership and governance together. The good news is we have already taken the first step by approving a new mission (Hooray!). Now we just need to put policies and procedures in place to support our new mission and empower

people to act. The Board is leading the way on this: please talk to them anytime for more information or to offer your input.

It is an exciting time at Peoples Church! I am excited to lead with you all into this next phase of our shared ministry.

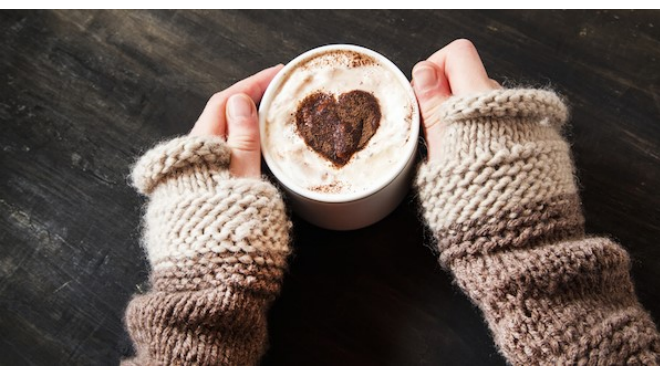
JANUARY 21

Joining the Online Directory

As many of you know our church has moved to a new church record keeping solution called Realm. It primarily serves the administrative needs of our staff, but it also offers some exciting opportunities to support the way you are involved in our church. Not only will this improve the work life for our ministry staff, it will make it easier for our church family to connect with each other, keep up with what's going on, and grow as a connected community.

Everyone in our church gets a unique profile. Your profile contains everything you want people in our church to know about you. Your profile also enables you to join a small group, RSVP to events, update your contact information, change family details, set notifications, and provide/update family photos. When creating your profile you can opt into the Online Directory which will allow you and others members to connect with each other. The Online Directory is a more up-to-date, dynamic version of the old printed church directory. You also get to determine your privacy settings on your profile for the Online Directory.

By joining the Online Directory, not only will you have access to other members contact information, we will be able to set up groups, pathways, and events. When you are part of a group, communication and notifications can be sent via Realm to everyone in that group. We can also create pathways for individuals such as setting up all the tasks for becoming a new member. Events can also be created for the church where you can RSVP, sign up to bring items or volunteer at the events. Realm is much more than just an administrative tool for the church, it is also a great communication and contact tool that all our members can use.

On **January 7th** and **14th** the membership committee will be available after the church to help folks opt-in to the Online Directory. If you have not already joined, please work with one of these members to set up your account and set your desired privacy settings so our directory can be more comprehensive and complete.



Home Church

Are you interested in exploring spirituality? Have you been looking for a nice way to get to know other people at church? Sign up to join one of our HOME CHURCH groups this spring semester!

Similar to "covenant groups" or "Small Group Ministry," HOME CHURCH is your opportunity to meet regularly (twice a month) with 3-5 other Peoples people to reflect on and discuss significant life topics. 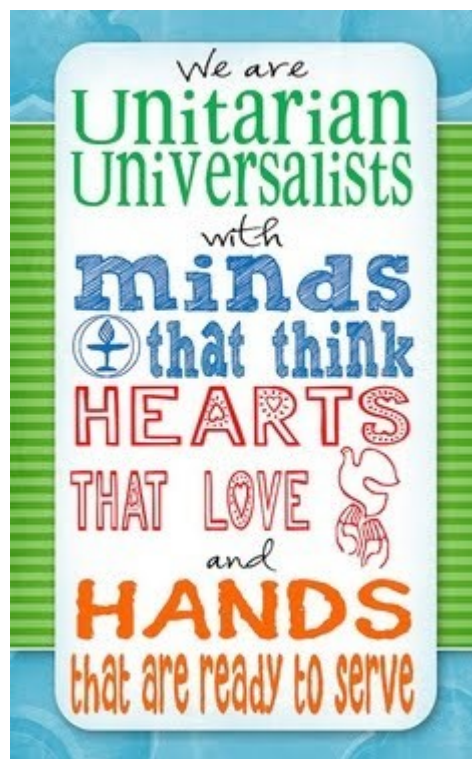
RE EVENTS

BOARD MINUTES

DECEMBER 13, 2017

- We discussed our common read, *Leading Change in the Congregation*, and shared the points of Chapter 3 that resonated most for each of us. We will read Chapter 4 for our next meeting.
- Treasurer Gary McGraw reported a cash flow deficit in November with an overall positive budget balance for the year so far. Also, the endowment increased about \$5K in the past month.
- The board asked the Aesthetics & Design Team to submit monthly progress reports on the sanctuary design project. We also discussed whether the team's mandate should include evaluating how spaces in the church are used. We will decide that at a future meeting.
- Scott Gay has agreed to coordinate the sanctuary wall repair project. The board did not have immediate questions and will look for more information and bids later this spring.
- Further revisions to the draft Policy on Policies will be discussed in subcommittee. The board will take up a new draft at a future meeting.
- Activities and structure for the February 3 Mission in Action workshop will be planned in subcommittee. The board will review and finalize plans at the January meeting.

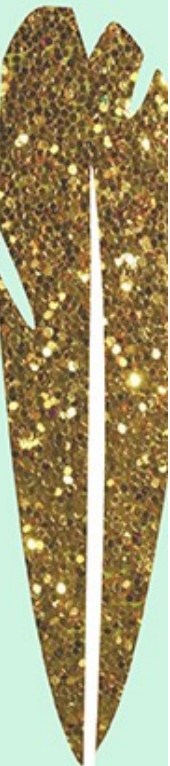
The recipients of our 2018 First Sunday Plate Collection based on the Congregational vote are:
