We announce this good news every week during worship, we share it with our friends and neighbors when we talk about our church, and it is time now to demonstrate it to our children.

For children to grow into wellgrounded Unitarian Universalists and lifelong seekers, they need to feel welcome in church right now, people, young exactly as they are, every single week, in every aspect of our life, common especially worship.

I say this based on all research, of my training, and personal experience. All the research indicates that if we send our children away every week into segregation during community worship time, we risk isolating them and sending them the message that they are not wanted in Unitarian

Universalism. They miss out on being part of the full common life of the congregation and so do the adults.

This happened to me.

As a UU child I hated being ushered out of the Sunday worship service with the rest of the kids after 15 minutes (just when things really started to get interesting!) It compromised and shortened both my Religious Education experience with the other kids my age and my worship experience. I craved having a full experience of both - although I doubt I could have articulated that at the time. I wanted to explore spirituality and faith in a small group of my peers and I wanted to with worship the whole mutigenerational community.

I may have missed out on this as a child, but I believe we can offer this

A new year of Faith Formation is upon us! I wanted to use the space this month to share a bit more detail about the new year!

Orientation will be September 9 at 9:45 am. Parents and children (ages 4 through 12th grade) will meet together in the large classroom in the back of the Faith Formation area. The room is mostly referred to as the green room. Room names are coming!!

During orientation, we will simulate what is going to happen for the students on Sunday mornings. We will have a time of gathering that includes singing, a bit of Unitarian Universalist history, and a bit of teaching about a religion of the world. It is important that the children in Faith Formation learn about the significance of UU'ism as well as the various faiths that make Unitarian Universalism unique and special.

After the time of gathering and orientation, the students will go with Rev. Rebecca and talk about worship. Worship is going to be different this year! We are looking forward to everyone worshipping together every week! Rev. Rebecca is going to ask the students what they like in worship and what they would like to see happen in worship in the future.

While the students are with Rev. Rebecca, the parents will stay together and hear more about the classes and some of the subjects and activities that are to come in the next few months. Some really fun events are in the works as well as some that are very serious and very important for the development of each student's faith! There will be times this year when the children will be able to choose between two subjects. Other times, all the students through 6th grade will be together. Parents will get a sneak peek!

There will be some snacks after these sessions.

We will conclude at 10:45 to give everyone about 15 minutes to get ready for worship.

This year 7-12 graders will meet as one group for a curriculum on other faiths. Youth will not only learn about other faith traditions, but also experience how those faith traditions engage the questions that their home church is wrestling with. This is a great chance for our older classes to bond and learn! These students will not join in the opening time, but rather go straight to their class where their teaching team will work with them.



Honoring Worship

Our theme for September services at Peoples is "worship."

I suspect most of us, whether or not we actually pay homage to any deity, tend to use this word to describe our Sunday services.

But, in a broader sense, worship, or "the formal or ceremonious rendering of...honor and homage" can be applied to whatever we consider important to us on a personal level.

Like, say, the Covenant of Right Relations we committed to a couple of years ago.

What would it look like to honor the Covenant? For example, the second behavior cited in it is that each of us will "do our fair share to make Peoples a strong, safe, welcoming community."

We can honor this particular agreement in a variety of ways. For example:

• We find ways to contribute financially to keep Peoples and its programs running. Pledging even \$5 or \$10 per month helps; this is


especially true during this year's Stewardship campaign, when pledges from people who have previously not pledged will be matched up to \$50 each. (Can you say "easy way to double my contribution"?)

- If we have a problem with someone in the congregation, we talk to that person directly, rather than talk about them to someone else.

 Conflicts of any type are a great chance to practice disagreeing without being disagreeable. By making this type of communication the norm at Peoples, we'll address one of our five

 Developmental Ministry goals, go a long way to preventing hurt feelings, keep molehills from turning into mountains, and enable everyone to feel a lot calmer and more powerful. Such a deal.
- We actively tackle approach newcomers so they don't end up standing alone and feeling awkward before or after the service. Even for those of us who are not particularly extraverted, Peoples provides a safe place to step up and talk. And, let's face it: Any of us who are already members are going to be far more comfortable than anyone who's visiting. It's a great chance to earn a newcomer's Hero Of The Day Award for making that personal connection.

So...What will you choose to do this month to honor our Covenant of Right Relations? (If you need a refresher course on it, you'll find it posted to the right of the doors to the Ely Room.)





Facility Changes

After some research and consideration we will be removing the large dumpster from our facility and relying only on the weekly garbage pickup by the city. The dumpster was rarely full and financially cost our facility a significant amount each year, plus we were paying for the garbage service through the city and not utilizing it.

With this change it is important to be more environmentally conscious to continue to reduce waste and recycle when possible. To help aid in this, the Lillian McGraw kitchen will be getting a new dishwasher which will eliminate the need to use paper products at large events. However, this also means we will need more volunteers at large events to help with the dishes. This is something that everyone can help with! Let's make this a successful change for both our church and the environment!




Stewardship Campaign September Update

Social Justice Forum
