to Peoples Church

UU), three denominational or associational affiliation changes (from originally Universalist, to Unitarian in 1928, and to Unitarian Universalist in 1961), and one location change (from 3rd Ave in downtown Cedar Rapids to Gordon Avenue in Northwest Cedar Rapids).

Phew! That's a lot of change!

So today I look back to our


Peoples Church founders with so much gratitude: they couldn't have known it then, but they started something that has radically and wonderfully changed my life for the better.







A Little Stewardship Humor


