the women and all survivors of domestic violence, the Indigenous people, and everyone else who is marginalized in our society (people experiencing poverty, black people, people with disabilities, etc.).

To do so consider diversifying your media and seeking out podcasts, articles, and books by marginalized people. Listen to local leaders of color and others on the margins. Tune into the


> lineup of Social Justice Forums we have going on this fall.

Wise Words

Are you anxious and worried about the upcoming election? Most of us have at least a bit of worry and concern about what is to come. None of us know exactly

what is going to happen only what we hope! The worry that we have as adults is also in our children. They have the same worries, concerns, and fears! What can you do? Talk to them at their level. Break things down to a level they can understand.

This part of an article on www.nationalgeographic.com by Cassandra Spratling helps us understand a bit better:

Elections can be fraught with tension and can bring up confusing questions from children. But the 2020 presidential election seems especially contentious, exposing intense emotions and questionable behavior that children might have trouble understanding. Add to that anxiety from the pandemic and a nation in the grips of a racial reckoning, and this election season can be particularly difficult for parents to navigate.

"This is a really scary time for children. There's a lot of change and fear and things moving away from what the whole normal used to be like," says Alyssa Westring, co-author of Parents Who Lead. "So it's our job to help them manage their fear and anxiety in ways that we might not have had to do before."

"[Talking] helps them understand themselves as a community member and can help facilitate their sense of responsibility to other people in their community," says Deborah Rivas-Drake, a University of Michigan educator who's coauthor of an ongoing study of civil engagement in a predominantly Latinx community. "You're planting seeds that will bear fruit later in terms of their understanding of themselves as civic and political actors who have agency."

Raising civic-minded children is also vital to the nation's future. "We have to do better at raising children to be civic-minded and informed so that they can make thoughtful political decisions in the future," says developmental psychologist Christia Spears Brown of the University of Kentucky, whose children are 16 and 10. "Life as we know it, for better or worse, is shaped by the decisions of our government, and we need engaged and informed citizens to create that government."

"Kids are really attuned to what's going on," says Spears Brown, who co-authored a 2019 study about kids and politics. Sometimes their knowledge is flawed or skewed, which is exactly

why it's important for parents to talk with their children. Here's how to get those conversations started.

I know all of the families at Peoples talk with their children and have great conversations with them. The election would make a great topic to add to those chats this month as we explore DEEP LISTENING. Listen to what they have to say—their fears, worries, and concerns. Help them understand the process, our responsibility as adults, and their responsibility as children!

Starting about 5:30 p.m. we will take the branches of trees you have brought previously, and any tree branches you bring that evening, and burn them in the campfire out back. Later, when ashes have cooled, we will gather and hold them.

Part 2 of this sacred ceremony will take place in the spring. Date TBD.

Logistics: Parking - pull in by mailbox and all the way around. Park with driver tires on the grass. Bring a chair. Bring a piece of wood to burn. Wear a mask, jacket if cool, and sturdy shoes for the labyrinth. Sit at a distance. Be together.




Linn County Food Bank is distributing food in the parking lot of First - through Friday.


