

Dear Ones,

Beloved Community.

What does that even mean? What does it look like? Where can it be found?

The truth is, I don't know. I have never actually experienced Beloved Community.

Beloved Community is a realized eschatology. It is that which is "not now and yet shall be." It is a world in which all are free from injustice and suffering.

None of us have ever known this world.

You may recall that the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. often talked about Beloved Community during his years of ministry. It was his way of describing his dream of a world without racism, poverty,

or inequality. It was his way of naming the common good.

But Dr. King did not invent the concept.

"Beloved Community" can be traced back to 19th century American religious philosopher Josiah Royce (1855-1916). Royce coined the phrase "Beloved Community" as "a spiritual or divine community capable of achieving the highest good as well as the common good." what we are up to as a faith community: nothing less than, "achieving the highest good as well as the common good."

It is a radical message to proclaim these days, isn't it? The common good seems to have really fallen out of favor in recent decades. Everyone is so concerned with individual rights and freedoms, that they forget about the rights and well-being of everyone else. But as my colleague Rev. Theresa Soto says, "All of us need all of us to make it."

Wise Words From David Wise Director Faith Formation



Anniversaries are usually a time that causes reflection!

With the 6 month anniversary of the derecho coming so close to the beginning of Lent what kind of message does that send? It is time we need to reflect. Couple that with the recent Developmental Ministry Survey of the congregation and there are many reasons to look back, look within, and look ahead.

Growing up Lent was not a time on the year that really meant much to me. I grew up in a Christian church but not one that practiced Lent. To me it was something that my Catholic friends did. As my life changed and I left the church of my youth I discovered the beauty and wonder of Lent. It has become something more important to me.

Lent is 40 days, not including Sundays, that Christians and others use as a time to improve themselves, reflect on where they are and where they are going. It is a time to think. It is a time to search within. It is a time to look to the future.

Around five years ago this congregation entered a period of reflection in order to improve itself. It was to be a five to seven year window to reflect, prepare, and seek direction for the times that are to come. As that window closes what has been learned? What can be gathered from all the changes that have been made?

What would a time of reflection say about Faith Formation? Right now so many things are hard because of the pandemic. What can become though? What needs to happen to make things even more

vital in the coming months and years?

The derecho devasted our community! The remnants are everywhere. On my way to the church I normally pass by Westdale Court Apartments. A sad reminder of that day. I take Jacolyn Drive on that trip as well. As I come down Jacolyn from Johnson Ave I am saddened every time at the loss of trees. The sky is beautiful but that drive used to be filled with trees. On that drive I recall and remember what was there and I remind myself that there is something better on the way.

As these anniversaries and Lent converge what about you? What can you improve? What can you do to bring more peace? What can you do to bring more justice?


#### SOCIAL JUSTICE





The Peoples Caste Book group will meet Tuesday March 2nd from 7pm. to 8:30pm. This is the first of four conversations we are going to have about Caste.


