I am leaving because we always knew this was a timelimited ministry and the day would come. Seizing this opportunity that has presented itself to me and relocating to a bigger city (with the added benefit of being

closer to my wife's family), is the right thing to do for my family at this time. It will also be good for my career and help me even better provide for my family and secure our future.

Rev. Leoma Leigh-Williams will speak about the Allen Lincoln Douglass Project, Granny's House, and Mentorship. This groups is our 2nd quarter First Sunday Plate Collection recipient. All are welcome!



We, the member congregations of the Unitarian Universalist Association, covenant to affirm and promote journeying toward spiritual wholeness by working to build a diverse multicultural Beloved Community by our actions that accountably dismantle racism and other oppressions in ourselves and our institutions.

Why the 8th Principle?

Our 7 Principles have never been etched in stone. Our Principles and its sources evolved and changed over time. In the 1970s and 1980s UU women prodded UUs to reconsider sexual assumptions and language in some of the original Principles and sources. The Principles were changed in 1985 in order to remove the male centeredness. At the same time, amid growing environmental consciousness, UU s added the 7th Principle- 'Respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part."

Today in 2021, as UUs we face another challenge. Black Lives Matter. As mainly white UUs are we ready to step up, understand our privilege and the white supremacist history of our nation and then say, we need another Principle? At Peoples we have been doing the work of dismantling racism and becoming anti-racist for three years. Now is the time for consideration of the 8th Principe.

The PCUU Board of Trustees at its May meeting has voted to approved the formation an 8th Principle Task Force which will work to prepare the congregation for its adoption at the December Congregational Meeting.

Developmental Ministry

Some members have expressed a need for further clarification of the "rankings" of the goals of the Developmental Ministry that have been reported as a result of the recent evaluation

Here is a chart from the report showing the percentage of respondents who said the goal had been reached are as follows:

| GOAL AREA | % OF RESPONSES |
|-----------------------------------|----------------|
| Financial Stewardship | 60% |
| Governance | 56% |
| Communications | 49% |
| Involvement in BroaderCommunities | 26% |
| Membership | 11% |

Those areas people think have the most work going forward can be read from the bottom up. Furthermore, the goal that most people thought had accomplished the most, Financial Stewardship, still had 40% saying more work is needed.
