Final Interim Minister Update

Listening to the Still, Small Voice Within

If nothing else, life is fluid. To move forward, we adapt.

Here is where we are and what changed.

The Interim Search Team and the Board of Trustees agree that David Wise, Director of Faith Formation is an excellent candidate to walk with us for the next year. The agreement is that he will return to Director of Faith Formation after this year when Peoples calls a settled minister in 2022. This idea was discussed by the search team early and ultimately became the best choice for Peoples.

Benefits: David knows us, has been on board with the values, mission, ends, and Faith Formation. He already knows the governance model that took much work to implement; tackled the AV-Technology matters in addition to the Faith Formation duties; has an excellent relationship with the staff; is experienced in pastoral care; and knows the wider community.

The church benefits by having a knowledgeable person step right in, no moving expense, and we can shift to a settled search this summer.

How did this option happen? We stopped struggling and listened to the still, small voice within. The team returned to the idea that had been floated early on and that is supported by Reverend Rebecca

Throughout, the Interim Search Team followed the process. They worked cooperatively with the UUA Transition office and inter-

viewed several likely candidates through rounds one and two of matching candidates and congregations. It didn't work.

Wondering, the Team asked "What did we do wrong?"

The answer from the UUA Transitional office: "Nothing."

Ultimately, the candidates selected congregations that offered more money, and ones other than in a mid-sized city in the Midwest.

We paused. Cleared our minds. Looked with soft eyes. Opened our hearts to possibilities. And, recognized that an excellent candidate was right before us.

So, we asked David to consider this interim position. Over the next several days we worked out details surrounding finances, duties, and future expectations.

We came to a happy agreement.

We also know that David cannot do all that he was doing and add this role to the mix. We have already started the process to find others to help with some of the tasks. These include a part-time Faith Formation and Technology people.

Our congregational job now is to continue working together this year as we select a settled ministry search team and let them do its work.

Building on the work of the Interim Search team's congregational profile, our challenge is to refine and present an accurate and exciting picture of our church and community, which will include a strong financial package for candidates who are in search next year.

The 8th Principle

We, the member congregations of the Unitarian Universalist Association, covenant to affirm and promote journeying toward spiritual wholeness by working to build a diverse multicultural Beloved Community by our actions that accountably dismantle racism and other oppressions in ourselves and our institutions.

Our Principles have changed in relation to society's demands in the 1960s, 1970s, and 1980s. It could be time for a change in the Principles in the 2020s because recent events have shown us that many Americans are still deprived of access to liberty, equality, and justice.


UUs are actually a part of the problem. Our congregations are and have always been white centered and of European heritage in membership and leadership roles. For people identified as white, it is too easy to ignore issues of systemic racism in our congregations and in society. This is exactly what keeps the system of racism alive and, in fact, worsening right now. We need to de-center whiteness and other dominant cultures in UUism.

The 8th Principle came from a feeling that we need something to renew our commitment to this work, to hold ourselves accountable, and to fulfill the potential of our existing principles. Our 8th Principle Task Force will be moving Peoples toward this goal of de-centering whiteness during the next 5 months. We thank Kris Davis, Laura McGraw, David Meissler-Kubaneck, Marcia Swift, Joye Winey, and Dick Woodward for their commitment to this work by serving on the Task Force.

At the GA Assembly in June 91% of the delegates voted to include anti-racism and anti-oppression in the 8th Principles. 112 UU congregations across the country have voted to adopt the 8th Principle.
