Dawna Markova, writes in "I Will Not Die an Unlived Life": I will not die an unlived life I will not live in fear of falling or catching fire. I choose to inhabit my days, to allow my living to open me, to make me less afraid, more accessible, to loosen my heart until it becomes a wing, a torch, a promise. I choose to risk my significance; to live so that which came to me as seed goes to the next as blossom and that which came to me as blossom, goes on as fruit.

The poem is a candle that my soul holds out to me, requesting I find a way to remember what it is to live a life with passion, on purpose. There is only enough light to take the journey step by step, but that is all any of us really needs. [...]

When you have the courage to shape your life from the essence of who you are, you ignite, becoming truly alive. This requires letting go of everything that is inauthentic. But how can you even know your truth unless you slow down, in your own quiet company? When the inner walls to your soul are graffitied with advertisements, commercials, and the opinions of everyone who has every known and labeled you, turning inwards requires nothing less than a major cleanup.

Traveling from the known to the unknown requires crossing an abyss of emptiness. We first experience disorientation and confusion. Then if we are willing to cross the abyss in curious and playful wonder, we enter an expansive and

untamed country that has its own rhythm. Time melts and thoughts become stories, music, poems, images, ideas. This is the intelligence of the heart, but by that I don't mean just the seat of our emotions. I mean a vast range of receptive and connective abilities, intuition, innovation, wisdom, creativity, sensitivity, the aesthetic, qualitative and meaning making. It is here that we uncover our purpose and passion.

By the time you read this, we have probably received the names of our ministerial applicants. It's now time to move into the next phase: discernment.

During December, we began preparing for the discernment phase by:

- developing criteria to complete our initial applicant review
- developing questions for the first round of prospect interviews

These criteria and questions were all based on what you indicated is important to our congregation. Thank you all again for your input!

We plan to review all our applicants and create a list of prospects by January 7. Once we have our list of prospects, we will begin scheduling screening interviews to identify our pre-candidates.

As a reminder: the Search Team cannot share any information about applicants to our position until we have identified and announced our candidate.

Faith Formation

Greetings all and Happy (early) New Year!

Like many of you, I'm a little bit in awe that 2022 is just a few days away. The last two years have been a time blur of pandemic stress, family isolation, community tragedy, and so much more that the traditional joy of a new year is understandably a bit tempered. That's real stuff, beloveds, and it affects us in ways we can't even tell.

One way to help handle the weight of the transition from year-to-year is with a Fire Ritual. My Welsh ancestors still do these, albeit on a larger scale, and there is a real catharsis and bonding in them. Here is a simple one you can do solo with your family:

Materials needed:

Flash Paper (or tissue paper, if flash paper is unavailable)
Fire safe container
Ignition source
Fire extinguisher, in case of emergency

Ritual:

Take a piece of paper, hold it to your heart

Visualize everything you wish to let go of in the last year being written on the paper When everything is there, crumple the paper into a ball and place in the container

Ignite the ball, breathing deeply as the burden you are carrying is lightened.

May 2022 be a year of blessing to you and yours, and may the Universe shine upon you everywhere you go.

Peoples Church Endowment Made Simple

Thanks to the generosity of Peoples members of the past and present the annual budget ended the year with a slight surplus.

Traditionally most Church income came from pledges. It still does but in the modern era most nonprofits, including Peoples, need more than annual member donations to be financially healthy. Enter the endowment.

An endowment is a pool of money, invested by a foundation, that has only one purpose...to yield an annual distribution to support operations or special needs.

Peoples has endowment assets invested with the UU Association in Boston and the Greater

Cedar Rapids Community Foundation. Most recent endowment gifts have gone to the local foundation.

Over the long term the CR Foundation's average growth has averaged 7.4% in the general pool and a bit higher in the new ESG Fund. This stands for Environment, Social, Government and invests in socially responsible companies. No gun or tobacco companies.

Contributing to an endowed fund is a way to perpetually give to Peoples Church and can create family legacies. Interested? Give Rich Patterson a call.



PETITION REQUESTS **AMENDMENTS TO IOWA'S NEW VOTING LAWS**

The League of Women Voters of Iowa and eight Iowa-based co-sponsors—including Interfaith Alliance of Iowa Action Fund—will present petitions to the leadership of the 89th General Assembly at Iowa's Capitol. The petition, which contains signatures of Iowa voters, urges legislators to repeal sections of the newly-enacted voting laws.

Iowa's new voter laws make voting harder, disqualifies voters more easily, shortens the voting time by 31%, makes elections more difficult to administer, and invites interference by political parties in elections. Registered voters can sign the petition online.

How to Set Your Privacy Preferences in Realm


By default, the viewing of your personal and contact information is limited to members of groups you are in, group leaders, and staff members. If you choose to, however, you can make your information visible to all registered users of our church's website.

- 1. Log into the site.
- 2. Click your name in the upper-right corner and select My Profile.
- 3. On the Info tab, next to Edit Profile, click to the privacy icon.
- 4. Select a family member (if more than one). NOTE: anyone with a "Family Position" of "Child" cannot be opted into the directory. Please ensure Family Position is correct.
- 5. Click one of the buttons above the line to apply that setting to all information in the profile, or click Custom Privacy and select a setting for each field.
- 6. Click Save.

While you can hide the majority of your information from most of your church, you should know that, regardless of your settings, contact data will still be visible to certain members of your church staff.

A family member with a primary position such as "Head" or "Spouse" can also change privacy settings for other members of the family.
