Pastor's Page

CONTENT WARNING: Gun violence is discussed.

In my lifetime there have been 3 men known as the Voice of the Gators. (the play by play announcer for football, basketball, and baseball.) The fourth was named on Wednesday.

In my lifetime there have been 12 men who have held the office of President of the United States.

In my lifetime there have been 11 people who have been Speaker of the US House of Representatives.

Since July 1st there have been at least 27 mass shootings in the US. (A mass shooting is typically defined as 4 people injured or killed).

Let that sink in for a moment!

There have been over 300 mass shootings in the US this year!

Over 10,000 people have died via gun this year (not including suicides).

Almost 3,000 kids and teens have been killed or injured by guns this year!

Where does it stop? When do we say enough is enough?

We can not continue at this pace of violence!

The Principles that we hold dear are very clear:

The inherent worth and dignity of every person.

The goal of world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all.

How do we get the rest of the country to come on board?

When do we stop sacrificing the lives of innocent people?

When do stop blaming mental health issues (There is a common misperception amplified by mainstream media and government officials that people "go crazy" or enter some altered state of consciousness and start shooting. Rather, executing murderous plots such as mass shootings at schools, grocery stores, places of worship, and public events requires a mind that is lucid and capable of producing rational thought, planning, and logical cognitive processing. For example, the 2017 Las Vegas Route 91 Harvest Festival shooter reportedly had extensive notes on distance, trajectory, and wind changes in his hotel room. These shooters are often linked with an adherence to ideas and rhetoric that are bandied about as truth on media outlets. On top of that, elected government officials with massive public platforms echo these "truths" and reinforce their so-called legitimacy. The result is a radicalized not mentally ill—individual absorbing all of this extremist ideology who then takes advantage of the easy access to guns in America. https:// www.psychiatrictimes.com/view/most-massshooters-are-terrorists-not-mentally-ill)

There are those who would like a strict interpretation of the Constitution. If we strictly interpret the constitution wouldn't that take us back to the days of flintlock pistols and muskets?

How many more lives? How many more children are we willing to sacrifice?

Finance Team Update


Through May we have received 61% of 2022 pledge income and we are currently running an operating surplus of over \$21,000 for the year. Thanks to Peoples People for your generosity!


