congregations in Iowa (Ames, Des Moines, Quad Cities) that are in the process of replacing called ministers and recently contracted with interim ministers.

After careful, thoughtful discussion, the Board and Search Committee will support possible inclusion of non-UU ministerial candidates in our search process. With approval from the Board, the Search Team has adapted existing UUA search guidelines. They felt this was necessary in order to delve deeply into any non-UU applicant's ability to effectively minister to a congregation like Peoples, with its plurality of beliefs. We will continue to provide information to the congregation as our journey of search continues.

On another note, Covid sub-variants continue to increase overall infection rates, we will continue to monitor CDC guidelines, please take necessary precautions and stay safe!




