Minister's Musings

The Article II Study Commission has proposed that we Unitarian Universalists articulate our shared faith as seven <u>Shared UU Values</u> (see image below). Additionally, they also proposed an update to our bylaw's "Inspirations" – which is where this month's theme is drawn from.

For December, the theme is <u>The Gift of Mystery</u>. Part of the draft text for the Unitarian Universalist Association's proposed bylaw change reads as follows:

Section C-2.3. Inspirations

Direct experiences of transcending mystery and wonder are primary sources of Unitarian Universalist inspiration. These experiences open our hearts, renew our spirits, and transform our lives. We draw upon, and are inspired by, sacred, secular, and scientific understandings that help us make meaning and live into our values. These sources ground us and sustain us in ordinary, difficult, and joyous times...

When I meditate on my direct experiences of mystery and wonder, I feel a mixture of awe, gratitude, and confusion. It can be scary to admit that I don't know the answers; it's difficult for me to relax into the not-knowing. When I am able to finally embrace mystery and wonder as part of my spiritual life, I am more likely to lean into trusting that the wider universe of beloveds will be with me on the journey into the unknown.





The group led the efforts against the Dakota Access Pipeline and continues to fight pipelines that threatens the Missouri River and Iowa's border to the east.

Finance Team Update


The Finance Team met on 11/14/23 to review financial reports, ABC's of abundance, and related items.


General Assembly Coming to YOU
