Finance Team Update

The Finance Team met on 5/23/23 to review bookkeeper reports and related items. Cash flow for April was positive due to prepayment of pledges and scheduled endowment disbursements:

- April income \$32,312
- April expenses \$28,226

We are grateful for the growth in endowment giving to the church. Increased endowment giving is helping the church grow its programs and live its mission.



HELP MAP OUR UU FUTURE AT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY!

Have you ever considered participating in a GA? Being a delegate? Attending some workshops?

The UU <u>General Assembly</u> will be held June 21-25 in Pittsburgh. There is also a virtual option that is very convenient. The Finance Committee and the Board have two very important issues that are going to be discussed and voted on at the 2023 GA:

- 1. The first deals with the Principles and a total re-write of the Principles as we know them today. Every voice needs to be heard in this crucial debate. Info has been in the Voice and Weekly for some time. For more information on this issue please contact <u>Marcia Swift</u>
- 2. The second issue is one which our Finance Team and Board of Trustees strongly opposes. It could decimate the Endowment Fund of the UUA, which is called the Common Fund. The resolution states that the Common Fund must provide a 'Complete Divestment from the Fossil Fuel Industry and Subsequent Reparations,' which was submitted by petition, because it would undermine the UUCEF's current values-based work on climate action and other human rights issues, close off the conversations we need to have about UU values and investments, pre-empt the work the UUA Board of Trustees has begun around reparations, and directly cut the UU budgets. The concept is good, but the sudden action and impact of that action on small churches is significant and very concerning.
