Minister's Musings

"In a real sense all life is inter-related. All [people] are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly. I can never be what I ought to be until you are what you ought to be, and you can never be what you ought to be until I am what I ought to be...This is the interrelated structure of reality." — Martin Luther King Jr., Letter from Birmingham Jail (1963)

Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s vision of an inescapable network of mutuality stands in stark contrast to the isolationism and authoritarianism found in politics these days. How do we resist the false claims that we are safer when we're independent? How do we lean into the interdependent web of all existence which holds us all? Given the very real climate crisis, how do we act together to benefit all?

Our Unitarian Universalist values can help guide us as we explore such questions. This month's theme is the "Gift of Interdependence." The Article II Study Commission proposes that we Unitarian Universalists envision Interdependence as one of the seven Shared UU Values. Here's what is said about this value:

Interdependence

We honor the interdependent web of all existence. With reverence for the great web of life and with humility, we acknowledge our place in it.





We covenant to protect Earth and all beings from exploitation. We will create and nurture sustainable relationships of care and respect, mutuality and justice. We will work to repair harm and damaged relationships.

Interdependence is an apt theme this month when we are celebrating our Installation and making our shared ministry official. May Peoples Church – which itself is an inescapable network of mutuality – encourage us all to be what we ought to be!

The Board of Trustees and Minister Working Together (part 2 of 2)

After the Board of Trustees and Rev. Carin jointly clarified their shared ministry priorities (as outlined in the March 2024 Voice), they affirmed a joint covenant between them. It reads as follows:

As we work to implement the PCUU mission – *Leading compassionate lives through spiritual growth and just action.* – we do covenant with one another to the following:

- 1. We value shared ministry and power sharing, so we covenant to invite all members to engage in the work of the congregation and the ongoing gift of co-creating Beloved Community.
- 2. We value lifelong learning, so we covenant to take risks, learn from our experiences, and practice appreciating everyone's efforts and work.
- 3. We value transparency, so we covenant to communicate directly and with compassion. Only when appropriate will we hold sensitive information in confidence.
- 4. We value a diversity of perspectives, so we covenant to approach one another with openness and curiosity, finding ways to increase understanding and deepen connections.
- 5. We value humility and honesty, so we covenant to repair any harm we have caused when the impact of our communications and actions are hurtful.
- 6. We value callings ("sacred yeses"), so we covenant to express and maintain clear personal and professional boundaries while also respecting the boundaries of others.
- 7. We value sustainability, so we covenant to create realistic plans based on the resources available.





An installation occurs when a congregation (in this case, Peoples Church Unitarian Universalist) acts to formally enter into shared ministry with their professional minister (in this case, Rev. Carin Bringelson).

Little Free Banned Books Library



Our 2nd quarter First Sunday Plate Collection will be donated to The LGBTQ+ Youth Center of Tanager Place. The Center provides a safe and confidential environment for LGBTQ+ youth, families, and allies. Programs include support groups, special art offerings, mentoring, Pride Cafe, health initiative classes, parent workshops, financial literacy, tutoring and career exploration.



In 2024 our congregation's social justice actions will be in the areas of LGBTQ+, Native American, and reproductive rights. In addition, we will be further supporting the Linn County Immigration & Refugee Association by collecting and donating items greatly needed by new members of our community who are arriving from other countries. Please Join Us a conversation with Father Michael Lapsley

Social justice activist, Fr. Michael Lapsley, South African Anglican priest, will be in Cedar Rapids in April to introduce the power of healing through the sharing of stories. Lapsley's own personal story as an anti-apartheid leader in South Africa is riveting. In 1990, three months after ANC leader Nelson Mandela's release from prison, Lapsley was sent a letter bomb by the apartheid regime. He was blinded in one eye and lost both hands when he opened the package.

After a long recovery from the bombing, Father Lapsley chose to dedicate his life to helping victims of emotional, psychological, and spiritual wounds inflicted by war, human rights abuses and other traumatic circumstances. He founded the Institute for Healing of Memories in South Africa in 1998. The institute's mission is to facilitate the healing process of individuals, communities, and nations.
