# **Minister Musings**

My mind feels *blown* by the invitation to practice joy – this months' theme – in the midst of the despair and outrage I feel given recent events. The **c**onstitutional crisis and disregard for the rule of law. The existential threats on trans lives. The lack of due process for immigrants and refugees. The environmental degradation that continues unchecked.

How is one supposed to practice JOY in the midst of all that is wrong with this world?! Our spiritual forebears might reply, "How can you <u>not</u> practice joy, given the gravity of the situation in which you find yourselves? You need <u>more</u> joy at these times – not less."

Indeed, many philosophers and theologians have paused to note how the Joy and Sorrow of our lives is woven fine. We cannot have joy without sorrow, for they interplay with and depend upon one another. As 19th century Lebanese poet Kahlil Gibran put it, "The deeper that sorrow carves into your being, the more joy you can contain. Is not the cup that holds your wine the very cup that was burned in the potter's oven?"



One of the ways I practice joy is by singing and dancing. I'm particularly buoyed by the song "This Joy" performed by the Resistance Revival Chorus. Especially for people who are the most systematically marginalized – the BIPOC, the disabled, the queer, the poor, the femmes, the fat, etc. – the song serves as a reminder that our joy need not be taken from us. Regardless of our identities, all of us can resist the temptation to slink back into our corners. Instead, we can make connections with each other and all we name as sacred – practicing joy within, between, and beyond us.

As you ponder and embody our theme of the month, <u>Living Love through the Practice of Joy</u>, I invite you to make a list of all the ways YOU practice joy. The world needs our joy more than ever. Let's practice joy together.


